

Location - About Klukshu:

- Klukshu is a traditional fishing village with space to support community gatherings.
- Klukshu is located roughly 64km/45 min. drive south of Haines Junction on the Haines Road.
- Travel time from Whitehorse to Klukshu is an estimated 2.5 hour drive/219km.



Klukshu Campsites:

- Campsites suitable for dry camping (no power or water) are available on site.
- Camp spaces are sufficient to accommodate tenting or recreational vehicles/camper parking.
- Camping spaces are first-come, first-served and will not be reserved/held. There are plenty of spaces available for everyone at Klukshu and nearby.
- There are outhouses with sanitizer available.
- We will have daily water delivery and waste removal services throughout.

Meals:

- A simple dinner will be available for those arriving on Monday afternoon and meals during the GA are
 provided starting on Tuesday morning for breakfast through Thursday for lunch. Note that dinner
 Thursday evening will not be provided.
- Guests are welcome to bring potlatch kits.

Elders Space:

- Tables and chairs will be set up in the community hall at Klukshu for Elders to gather and visit.

Meeting Venue:

- The meeting and most of our activities and entertainment will take place in white big-top tents.
- Meals will be prepared in the community hall located adjacent to the meal and meeting tents.

Indian Days Activities Venue:

- Outdoor Indian Days activities will be held near the big-top meeting tent.

Recommendations and Site Rules:

- Please bring Potlatch bags, Coffee/Tea mugs and Water bottles
- Children must be supervised at all times
- No playing in the creek at any time
- Only non-motorized water equipment can use the boat launch
- Please use garbage/recycle cans available on site
- All dogs must be on a leash at all times
- Absolutely no dogs allowed in Meeting or Event tents
- Due to dry conditions, absolutely no fires
- Please respect other campers and Klukshu residents
- Please clean camp site after use
